## When the Chips Are Down...

*"We are continually faced by great opportunities brilliantly disguised as insoluble problems..." Lee Iacocca*

This has been a transitional year. The convergence of several events has made difficult circumstances even more difficult. Not ignoring my own lapses in leadership, any one of these things alone might cause stress. But together, they make for a toxic soup... or, wonderful opportunity, depending on the point of view one chooses to take.

Based on competition in funding, legislative changes, and societal trends the board decided to pursue a strategic focus on programs at Boys Ranch with no associated community based services. As a result, family case management services were eliminated in six Family Resource Centers and the Center for Women and Children (Girlstown, USA). The impact has been resounding.

For those we serve, we allowed generous timelines for ending services to them. The termination of therapeutic relationships requires a process and the families we were helping would not be able to replicate the support they were receiving from Cal Farley's. I received several panic calls from parents, but our strong professional social worker team used remarkable finesse to settle them.

For the employees whose jobs were impacted, there was an underlying sense of disappointment, and in some cases feelings of betrayal in losing their jobs. Some of these employees had relatively long and dedicated tenures with Cal Farley's, and some struggled with the sense that maybe their efforts were not appreciated or understood.

More often than not, however, I received responses from this group expressing appreciation for the experience of working for Cal Farley's and having a hand in the furtherance of our mission.

Alumni always are very attentive to change. This is normal and will always be present. Helping them (you all) understand change is necessary, and probably underrated in terms of its importance. Some who don't support change, probably won't, ever.

What I believe; however, is that disagreement with change often stems from lack of understanding rather than flat out resistance. And, leaders among our alums who understand the world of work and who have accepted changes in our programs over the years have expressed nothing but support.


Business partners have been witness to the changes. Whatever facet of the work they support, most have experienced such transitions in their own businesses, so they understand it. The biggest concern among vendors, insurers, bankers, and lawyers is the potential of losing our business. And, the byproduct of that is increased sensitivity to fees and quality of service... not a bad thing.

And finally, donors and sponsors who support Cal Farley's financially have an important stake in our efforts. Most donors are not local. They contribute because they believe in our mission, paying most attention to values rather than program configuration... they are mostly oblivious to the changes.

Locally, it's a little different. Some have been caught off-guard by the perceived suddenness of some of the changes they see. But, I have yet to come across anyone who openly disagrees with strategic decisions after taking time to listen to our rationale. Again, there is a general sense of trust that the board and staff are making decisions in the best interest of the children and organization as a whole.

Now, when the chips are down, in the most challenging of times, we all must step up in our support of our youth and those closest to our mission centered work... the heartbeat of the organization.

All of our attention is back on Boys Ranch. In some ways, it's like going back in time, but our programs look very different now than they were in the past. The interests of young people and the opportunities available to them have changed dramatically. Old staples like the work program, the Rodeo, and FFA, all still exist, but have a place on a much larger continuum of options for youth.

This month, we'll be celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of girls coming to Boys Ranch!

And next month, we are opening a new home –the Waldrup home. This will provide beds for 12 more boys, at which time we'll have a capacity for 296 youngsters. We'll not go back to the days of having over 400 at Boys Ranch, but the ones we have will have the experience of a lifetime... one that will serve them well from now on.

So, we'll keep the fire burning at Boys Ranch...

One member of my staff commented, "Dan, it never seems good enough," and I responded, "You are exactly right, it will never be good enough." And, failure in the pursuit of being better, would only come through NOT exploiting the opportunities that reside in the perceived problems. And, we're going to keep the fire burning.


### Needed - 40 Fabulous Family Members
