Somewhat shielded to not bare the stress and uncertainty that saddles folks with trying to provide for their families and loved ones. BR/GT instead wanted us to be occupied with getting a good education and developing a work ethic that has been for many of us the ticket to our survival and even career advancement.

I would love to share with you an A - Z formula that you could follow so that the pains would go away and promise everything will be grand. Problem is, I personally have had to deal with this perplexing economy. Perhaps one of the scariest things to all of us is that we have recently had to accept that we had *faith* there were those who are much smarter than we who were *watching our backs* and never let these types of things happen, just to find out they did not. 
