Sam Tennyson

Sam Tennyson began working as a Youth Worker at Boys Ranch in August 2017. Sam supervises, mentors and cares for boys and girls of all ages on the campus. Prior to his employment at Boys Ranch, he was working as

an automotive mechanic in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area. The money was good but Sam said there was something missing from his life — happiness. He said there was a feeling that he should be doing something else, giving back in some way. "Giving back" because Sam too, grew up at Boys Ranch. "My family thought I was crazy for leaving a high paying job to go back to the campus and work with kids". His



response to their concerns was simply, "I want to go back to BR and work because I want to be happy in life. I want to help other kids who were in my situation. Plus, I just care about that place – it's home."

When Sam was placed at Boys Ranch, he was failing in school, relationships with family were strained, he was full of anger and a self-proclaimed "hell-raiser". Sam didn't think about the future or school or what his life might look like tomorrow. When Sam was placed at Boys Ranch, one of the biggest changes was having a daily routine. He said it was strange to be going to school every day but began to realize there was life after childhood and he better start preparing for it. "I wasn't used to being around teachers who actually cared. I learned to work, go to school and began to think about college. The relationships he

developed began to have an impact on him as well.



Trust was difficult for Sam but time after time, incident after incident, Sam's houseparents supported him. He remembers, "Their support was unconditional and they always had my back." Houseparents, teachers, coaches as well as other staff members provided guidance, safety and purpose for Sam. Now, as an employee he is providing that same

support for current residents. "It's tough to watch kids when they're struggling. I know what they've been through and what they're feeling. When I see that, I reach out to them and tell them I understand because I've been there. It's amazing when you really care and show the kids respect, that you're not just there for a paycheck, the difference it makes in that relationship."
